Even with the Montgomery GI Bill, many Soldiers still lack the financial means to pursue their greater educational goals. The 28th Infantry Division Association Scholarship Fund was established to help bridge the gap and allow our Soldiers access to additional educational opportunities by helping them cover educational expenses.

Thanks to the hard work of a handful of volunteers, starting last year, three annual \$500 scholarships were given on behalf of the Association through the Pennsylvania National Guard Scholarship Awards Program.

Applications are available in the spring from the Pennsylvania National Guard Scholarship Fund, Building 0-47, Fort Indiantown Gap, Annville, Pennsylvania with a deadline for submission of June 30th.

The scholarship is open to all 28th Infantry Division members or the children of members who were either killed in action or permanently disabled while on active duty.

Our first scholarship is named after our first Division Commander. This year's recipient of the MG John Frederick Hartranft, 28th ID Association Scholarship was SPC Joseph Bacorn, D Co., 1/109th IN and F Co., 228th BSB

SPC Joseph Bacorn attends PSU, University Park, and wants to pursue a career in Government as a lawyer or other government official. SPC Bacorn has been an Army National Guard member since 2009 and deployed to Kuwait as an Armed Personnel Escort. SPC Bacorn has served in numerous leadership positions and received many recognition awards in college and the military. As a bicycling enthusiast, he plans to ride across the USA or hike the Appalachian Trail to raise money for disabled veterans.

Our second scholarship is named after our President that founded the Annual Benefit Dinner and our Scholarship Fund. This year's recipient of the SSG Walter K. Chmiola, Jr., 28th ID Association Scholarship was PFC Emily Grimes HHC, 1/104 AVN.
